WHAT IS APPRENTICESHIP?

Apprenticeship...

- Combines supervised, structured on-the-job training with related theoretical instruction and is sponsored by labor/management and employer groups that have the ability to hire and train in a work environment.
- Prepares people for skilled employment by conducting training in bona fide and documented employment settings. The content of training, both on-the-job and related instruction, is defined and dictated by the needs of the specific occupation within an industry.
- Has requirements that are clearly delineated in federal and state laws and regulations. The National Apprenticeship Act of 1937 (also known as the Fitzgerald Act) and many state laws provide the basis for the operation of formal apprenticeship training programs in the U.S.
- Leads to a Certificate of Completion and official journeyperson status. These credentials have explicit meaning, recognition, and respect in the eyes of federal and state governments and relevant industries.
- Pays wages to its participants during the on-the-job training phase of their apprenticeship and increases these wages throughout the training program in accordance with a predefined wage progression scale.
- Teaches the participant by working directly under the supervision of masters in the craft, trade, or relevant occupation area.

WHY A UNION APPRENTICESHIP?

There are many advantages in becoming a Union Apprentice. First, you're represented by a committee comprised of trustees from both labor and management with the authority to oversee your progress in the apprentice program.

You'll become a member of a Local Union, which is a group of workers in your trade that as a unit negotiates a contract with employers. Your wages throughout your career will be based on industry standards and the cost of living. You don't have to negotiate your wage as an individual and aren't required to renegotiate your wage if you change employers. Apprentices receive specified increases as they advance through the program.

In addition, the collective bargaining agreement includes a benefits package with such necessities as medical and pension plans, life insurance and educational benefits. They are part of the agreement and if you change employers, provided you are employed by another signatory contractor, they will continue without a lapse.

Union apprentices have established working conditions governing assigned tasks:

- You have union representation that can investigate unsafe conditions and give advice and support.
- Your employer is required to supply specific safety equipment and you'll receive safety training.
- Your hours of work are restricted to designated periods of time or you must be compensated at a premium rate for variations of the work hours.
- You'll have established holidays and if required to work, you'll be paid at a premium rate.

Union apprenticeship programs have a history of established comprehensive, tuition-free apprentice training. Classes are taught by qualified journeymen with practical jobsite experience. Instructors have special training and use nationally recognized textbooks. Upon completion of apprenticeship, additional classes ensure that you're trained in the latest technology and can obtain or renew required certifications and qualifications.

Upon completion of the apprentice program, you may relocate to other Local Unions in the U.S. and have the same protection offered at the original local.

In summary, as a union apprentice, you'll be compensated fairly and have the ability to advance in the industry. You'll be given courtesy and respect that qualified, dependable, industrious workers deserve.

Electrical Apprenticeship Program

Electrical Apprenticeship Program is backed by the Maryland Chapter, National Electrical Contractors Association and IBEW Local 24, our five-year electrical apprenticeship program offers an in-depth introduction to the wireman trade, taking students from craftsmanship through apprenticeship.

Each participant will receive on-site job training and classroom coursework to help them build a successful career. Apprentices will have the opportunity to work on-site with a NECA contractor, giving them the opportunity to learn first-hand. The on-site work will be supplemented by coursework developed using the Electrical Training Alliance curriculum.

- Minimum of 18 years of age (birth certificate required).
- Minimum of 10th grade education (copy of school transcript required).
 An applicant may apply for the program with less than a 10th grade education providing he/ she agrees to enter and completed a GED program within 12 months or less.
- Must be physically capable of performing work duties of the trade.
- Completion of apprenticeship application form.



Baltimore-Washington Laborers' Training & Apprenticeship

The JATC governs all training for Sprinkler Fitters Local 669. This encompasses our more than 10,000 active journeyman and more 4,000 apprentices.

The apprenticeship program is a five-year program with on-the-job training and a 19 course correspondence through a nationally recognized university. Once you have entered the apprenticeship program and have completed your six-month probationary period you will be become a member of Local 669. An apprentice is paid at a percentage of the journeyman wage. Each six months of the apprenticeship the apprentice records are reviewed to make sure that there is satisfactory progress both on-the-job and in the related training courses. Satisfactory progress means advancement to the next classification and a wage increase until the apprentice completes the five-year program.

Cement masons and plasterers are the craftspeople who work primarily with concrete and plaster materials, using a variety of skills and tools unique to this basic trade. An apprentice working as a cement mason will do the "finishing" work that complete jobs like curbs and sidewalks on highways, buildings, and in communities. Applications must be made online at local5training.com. The Washington DC Joint Plumbing Apprenticeship Committee (JATC) accepts applications for the Apprentice Program all year but intakes apprentices in late winter and spring. There is an application fee.
