I) IBEW (ELECTRICIANS)APPLICATION OPENING

IBEW Local 595 usually accepts applications on the last Friday in January in person for one day only. This year applications will be taken online. While it's possible the local may continue their practice of accepting applications for one day only (the date would be January 29 this year), they are considering extending the application process to a period of 10 days or potentially the whole month. II) MATH & MECHANICAL TEST PREP CLASS

Do you need help passing the union trades **entrance exams**? Currently, only 5 - 10% of the labor pool passes these rigorous exams. Far too many people in the Bay Area are unaware of career opportunities in the union construction trades. In response to these challenges, we have partnered with the Bay Area Apprenticeship Coordinators Association (BAACA) to produce a Pre-Apprenticeship and Apprenticeship Guidebook.
